**FUEL PRICES: WHERE ARE THEY GOING--AND HOW TO COPE**

If you've fueled up your tow vehicle, motorhome, or toad car lately, you know that the pain is back. Gasoline is up, and diesel is closed out 2010 at the highest price in over two years. With the RV industry trying to crawl up out of the mire of the recession, it's probably the last thing the manufacturers and retailers want to hear.

Where is it all going? It depends on who you listen to. A former oil company president, John Hoffmiester, recently trotted out his opinion on CNN, \$5 a gallon for gasoline by 2012. Scary stuff, no? On the other hand, in the same article, another petroleum pundit, Tom Kloza, chief oil analyst with Oil Price Information Service says "Americans will see gasoline prices hit the \$5 a gallon mark in the next decade, but not by 2012."

So who's right? Unless you have a flawlessly accurate crystal ball, it's just about anybody's guess. Three years ago when we were stunned at paying \$4.99 a gallon for diesel at a "highway robbery" fuel station in remote central Nevada, we could never have predicted the huge drop in fuel prices that would come in just a few months. Of course, we couldn't have predicted the plunge the

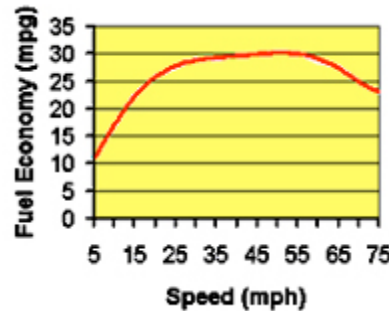
economy took either. There are so many variables, so many different pieces of the economic puzzle, it's a sure bet that nobody really knows what fuel prices are going to do in a year, and hardly in the next few months.

So what's to do? Drive like you want to save your money. It seems the research indicates a couple of critical things that all RVers — all drivers for that matter — can do to conserve that precious propellant is to slow down and keep the wind in your tires. For every pound of pressure under the recommended inflation rate, your tires' rolling resistance increases by almost 1.5%. A 10% increase in rolling resistance (7 pounds under-inflation) means up to a 2% increase in fuel consumed. It all adds up.

Add to the picture: An under-inflated tire dramatically increases stopping distance. Motorhomes and rigs pulling trailers already have increased stopping distances when compared to autos, factor in an under-inflated tire and the potential for a traffic disaster is very real. And under-inflated tires have a tendency to bend at the sidewalls, and are more likely to shear off tread. If you've priced tires recently, you'll know you don't want

to have to replace them any sooner than you have to.

And on the speed issue? Every rig has its "sweet spot" in terms of fuel economy. As a rule of thumb, however, consider that for every 5 miles per hour over 60 miles per hour you drive, you increase your fuel consumption. In terms of "old world dollars," when fuel cost \$2.87 a gallon, that extra 5



miles per hour effectively tacked on 24 more cents to your gallon. Driving aggressively on the highway, punching the accelerator, hitting the brakes, and jack-rabbing back to freeway speeds penalize you as much as 33%.

Finally, lighten up. Check your storage areas and unload excess stuff. If you don't need it, why pay to tote it?

Fuel prices? It's kind of like walking into an amusement park with a blindfold on. You climb on the roller coaster and take the blindfold off. We're all together on the ride, and who knows just what'll happen next.
