DIGITAL TV SIGNAL STRENGTH

Have you added a [Winegard Wingman™](#) to you Airstream's TV antenna to help pull in the HD digital signals? If so, you have made your antenna somewhat directional. It needs to be pointed at the strongest signal before you do the channel scan.



I discovered this handy device called a [SureLock™](#) from King Controls. You disconnect your TV from the antenna output in the Airstream and connect this device. Then, you rotate the antenna until you get the greatest number of LEDs to light. At that setting, you are pointed at the strongest signal. Re-connect your TV and do the channel scan.



I tried it at our Jacksonville rally and it performed very well. You can find them on-line or at your favorite RV supply store for around \$40.00.

BLUEGRASS FESTIVAL RALLY; MARCH 14 – 19; FORT CHRISTMAS HISTORICAL PARK

Come join us in Christmas, Florida for the Bluegrass Festival Rally. This event is similar to our Cracker Christmas event, except the crowds are smaller and there is somewhat less work to do. During the weekend, professional Bluegrass bands will be playing continuously during the festival.

The rally fee for is \$10.00 per person. Frank will collect from you at the rally. Parking is free with rally electric and water. The meals included in your rally fee are: Wednesday evening, hoagie supper; Thursday morning, pancakes; Friday evening, barbecue pot luck, (everyone bring a side dish to feed 6 to 8); Saturday morning, pancakes and sausage; Saturday afternoon, lunch; Sunday morning pancakes and sausage; and Sunday afternoon, lunch.
