Then she will begin chemo and radiation for the next few weeks. She and Herb appreciate all those praying for her and it is helping. We thank you all for the cards, prayers and concerns for her. This is a caring unit, and we love you all. Thank you, **Ron and Alice**.”

## RECOGNIZING A STROKE

Being able to recognize a stroke victim quickly and getting the proper medical care within 3 hours of the incident may totally reverse any effects.

There are three questions to ask of the individual using the letters R, S, T to make remembering easy.

R. Ask for him/her to **RAISE BOTH ARMS**.

S. Ask for a **SMILE**.

T. Ask the person to **TALK** and **SAY A SIMPLE SENTENCE**, i.e., It is a sunny day out.

Another sign is to ask the person to stick out his/her tongue. If the tongue goes to one side, it is an indication of a stroke

Anyone of these may indicate a problem. Call 911 immediately and explain the circumstances to the dispatcher. Time is of the essence.


## AN AMERICAN ICON
